AIP Study Gisburn Road Church Street to Blacko

The Study shows that an average of 13000 cars uses this length of Gisburn Road each day and during the period 2000-2005 twenty-five accidents involving personal injury occurred. The Study highlights problems at most of the main junctions between Church Street and Dickie Nook.

The recommendations are that some of the remedial work can be carried out as routine maintenance and that the recommended new traffic measures costing £14000.00 be submitted for inclusion in next years budget.

Remedial Measures:

- The Globe on the northern side of the A682 zebra crossing was missing during a site visit.
- The centre lines at the bend east of Church Street and the Eastbound Slow markings by Pasture Lane have worn away.
- The existing zebra crossing ahead warning sign sited on lighting column 33 needs illuminating.

New Traffic Measures:

- **Junction with Halstead Lane:** Lay new centre line markings thus offsetting the existing centre line by 1 metre on the northern side of Gisburn Road. (Reccom. 5,1,a)
- **Junction of Park street:** Either construct a 0.8metre over-run narrow strip over the footway, which will allow a wider eastbound lane especially by 191 Gisburn Road or consider a short length of Traffic Regulation Order (double yellow lines) on A682 northeast of Park Street. (Recomm 5,1,b)
- **Zebra Crossing East of Halstead Lane:** Construct 1 metre wide build out at the southern side of the zebra crossing. (Recomm 5,1,c)
- **Junction with Colne road:** Take down and dispose of the sign assembly on post S3 36. Provide permanent new interactive new interactive sign together with new 'side road on bend' on new post approximately 110 metres north and lay adjacent slow markings in the carriageway.
- **Junction With Barnoldswick Road:** Either realign the kerblines prior to the junction with Barnoldswick Road or use 1 metre wide nearside cross hatched markings when northeast bound. (Recomm 5, 3,e)
