Neighbourhood Plan 6 Week Public Consultation Starts Monday 23rd October



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Public consultation on the Regulation 14 Draft Neighbourhood Plan begins 9am Monday the 23rd October and will run until 5pm on the 1st of December. This six week consultation period is your opportunity to read the Neighbourhood Plan and comment on anything you disagree with.

The Plan will be available to view at Holmefield House, Nelson Town Hall, on Barrowford Parish Website and anywhere you see a poster of the front cover (left). It is important that as many local people look at the plan and respond. Once the consultation period has ended all comments received will be considered and where appropriate will be included as amendments to in the submission plan (Regulation 16). This will be submitted to Pendle Borough Council who will consult for a further 6 weeks.

A planning inspector is then appointed and the plan is considered for conformity with both National Planning Policy and the Local Plan.

The Inspector will decide if the plan conforms to planning policy, needs slight amendment to conform or is not fit for purpose. If the latter is the case then a serious revision or fresh start of the plan needs to be undertaken.

For either of the first two options the opinions contained in the Inspector's decision are taken into account and the Neighbourhood Plan proceeds to its final stage, a Public Referendum.

If the Plan is approved by a majority it then becomes part of the policy documents contained in the Local Plan.

Once it has reached this stage it has the same weight as the Local Plan when future planning applications are considered and may be the basis for refusing them.

Duck Etiquette Signs for Victoria Park



Pendle's Council are putting up a signpost at the duck pond in Victoria Park on which

three signs will be displayed in sequence, to reduce the amount of food dumping occurring at this location and its harmful effects on wildlife and the pond.

Lee Johnson, Pendle Council's Senior Park Keeper, said: "This is an issue in the majority of Pendle's parks. We've devised these signs in conjunction with Barrowford Parish Council's Carr Hall ward councillors and hope that their wording and variety will help to reduce the problems. Pendle's Environmental Crime staff follow up and prosecute those dumping food and other waste, but we have to find a balance so that people can continue to enjoy feeding the ducks and other birds sensibly.

"Park users should remember that food



should not be thrown in the ponds, as it can create poisonous bacteria and algae, and that a bread rich diet is bad for birds, creating unpleasant faecal waste, and of course attracting vermin. I was very pleased to hear that, thanks to a donation, appropriate duck food is available free of charge from the Victoria Park Pavilion cafe."



Changes to Waste & Recycling Collection

At the September Executive meeting of Pendle Borough Council four options for the collection of both household waste and recycling were discussed. It was decided to hold a consultation exercise on two of the options. Fortnightly residual refuse collection, four weekly recyclable waste collection, chargeable garden waste, no separate food collection.

1. Three weekly residual collection, three weekly recyclable collection, chargeable garden waste and no separate food collection.

The need for the proposed changes is to offset a loss of £760,000 in current income from Lancashire County Council through

the County Council's cancellation of a joint Cost Saving Agreement.

The measures will save up to $\pm 300,000$. At the same meeting the following charges and increases were approved:

- Administrative charge of £15+vat for replacement waste bins.
- Bulky household waste collection charge of £10+vat.
- Increase in Green Bin charges to $\pounds 35+vat$.
- Mechanical road sweeping being reduced by two vehicles saving £81,000.

The cost of a second village defibrillator (AED) has been shared between the Parish Council, Friends of Holmefield House who donated \pounds 500 and the Pendle Powerfest who also donated \pounds 600. The Friends of Holmefield House raised their share of the funding through monthly Craft Fairs and car boot sales.

Linda Crossley, Chairman of the Friends of Holmefield House said: "We would like to thank the crafters who have supported us for the past six months and especially Diana and Rita who have made some delicious cakes to sell. Janet Crossley sells fabulous knitted goods and jewellery and Lynne Ward offers health and relaxing products, all very reasonably priced.

"We have now finished our monthly fairs but will be holding a Christmas Craft Fair on December 10th, a perfect opportunity to finalize your Christmas shopping and join friends for coffee and mince pies."

The first defibrillator in Barrowford, on the outside of the public toilets at the

Fleece, Gisburn Road, was entirely funded by the Barrowford Lifestyle Festival.

Linda added: "We are delighted to have been able to help provide another lifesaving defibrillator for the people of Barrowford and would like to thank everyone who has supported us over the year. Despite the poor weather, crafters and car-booters have come along to be part of the action."

New Car Park at Holmefield House

Now that planning permission has been given for the extension of the car park at Holmefield House work will begin as soon as tenders for the project have been approved. The work will increase the current provision of six spaces to twenty with further provision of three disabled spaces and a drop-off bay.

The work will include the widening of both the current entrance and exit as well as the introduction of a one way system with road marking to the highways.

The Lime Tree to the front of the building will remain whist several others will be removed to facilitate the works.

A landscaped area adjacent to the raised beds will be planted with fruit trees including apple, pear, plum and cherry, and a mixture of soft fruit bushes. It is hoped that these trees and bushes will not only provide a habitat and food source for pollinating insects and birds but also provide some fruit for the Luncheon Club.

New Electric Cable Laid to Cricket Club

Another milestone in the restoration of the cricket pavilion at Bullholme has been reached with the laying of a new electrical supply across the playing fields. The work was funded by a generous grant of $\pounds 6000$ from the Barrowford & Western Parishes Area Committee with the remainder of the money coming from Neighbourhood Services at Pendle.

The works were carried out by a local contractor with minimal disruption to the football pitches. A donation from a local entrepreneur will help meet the costs of completing the electrical works at the pavilion. An application to the Directors of Barrowford Show Ltd has been made to fund any possible shortfall and, it is hoped, some new mowing equipment.
